The *Day Nurseries Act* (DNA) is the law governing child care in Ontario. The DNA states that no person shall establish, operate or maintain a day nursery (child care centre) without the authority of a licence.

The DNA allows a person to care for a maximum of five unrelated children (other than their own children where care is provided in their own home) under the age of 10 without a licence. This is the maximum number of children who can be in care at any time without a licence, regardless of the number of adults present.

The Ministry of Education follows up on complaints about possible violations of the DNA. Any person convicted of operating a day nursery (child care centre) or private-home daycare agency without the authority of a licence is liable to a fine of not more than \$2,000 for each day of operation and/or imprisonment for up to one year.

This means that it is illegal for individuals to look after more than five children under 10 years of age, in addition to their own children where care is provided in their own home, without a licence. It is also illegal to provide private-home day care at more than one location without a licence.

Representatives from the ministry's (*list region here*) Regional Office visited this location on (*date*).
